Spectators' Code of Conduct

We all have a responsibility to promote high standards of behaviour in our sport.

This association is supporting Archery GB's policies to ensure archery can be enjoyed by everyone in a safe and positive environment.

Play your part and observe CWAA's Respect Code of Conduct for spectators and parents/carers at all times.

I will:

- Remain outside the safety boundaries and behind the Waiting Line (where provided).
- Never engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour.
- Always respect the match officials' decisions.
- Applaud effort and good play as well as success.
- Ensure that mobile phones (and other devices) are 'off' or 'silent', and people will not conduct telephone conversations within earshot of the participants.

In addition, when attending youth fixtures I will:

- Remember that children take part for FUN.
- Let the coaches do their job and not confuse the participants by telling them what to do.
- Encourage the participants to respect the opposition and match officials.
- Never criticise a participant for making a mistake - mistakes are part of learning.

I understand that breaches of the code may result in action being taken by County of Worcester Archery Association and /or ArcheryGB.

All attendees at a tournament are reminded that 'coaching on the line' – indeed all communication with an archer on the shooting line – is forbidden by the GNAS Rules of Shooting. Any breach of this rule may result in the archer being disqualified and/or the offending 'coach' being asked to leave.
